We strive to not only provide a seamless experience for the consumer, but also equip our partners with tools for success:



History of Gilmerton House

Steeped in tradition and grandeur, this estate is a unique offering in our property collection. It's undergone a myriad of developments at the hands of thirteen generations of the **Kinloch family**. Soon after acquiring Gilmerton House, Sir Francis Kinloch became Lord Provost of Edinburgh and, in 1686, he was named a baronet of Gilmerton. Almost two centuries later, the current owner and 13th baronet of Gilmerton, Sir David Kinloch, returned to the estate in 1980, finding the house in disrepair and in dire need of an upgrade.

Pentrehobyn Hall is a Grade One-listed Jacobean Manor dating from 1540 just inside North Wales in Flintshire, near Chester. The Pentrehobyn Estate is approached via a long tree-lined drive and is set among 100 acres of lush parkland. Rich in history, the private country house dates back to medieval times








History of Pentrehobyn Hall

The Lloyds of Pentrehobyn are descended from Hywel ap Edwin who was elected Prince of Wales in 1096. Inside the house, there are two sets of early 17th-century carvings above the dining room and hallway fireplaces, which commemorate the successful attack by the Prince of Wales against the army of Randolph, Earl of Chester. Three Englishmen's heads were presented to the Prince of Wales who, in turn, granted these as the Lloyd ancestor's coat of arms.

History of Dunskey Estate

Dunskey Estate (also known as Portree Estate) is a B-listed mansion that dates back to the start of the twentieth century. The estate was the property of the Hunter-Blair family, later of Blairquhan in Ayrshire, and was acquired when Jane (or Jean) Blair of Dunskey, wife of James Hunter, succeeded her brother to Dunskey estates in 1777. A house dating from 1706 was extended in the 1830s, before The Rev James Blair acquired the estate in 1648.

The castle has gone through various changes and expansions since the 1500s, and our latest accomplishment was completing the chapel in 1870 thanks to John Gordon.
